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• CHAPTER 1 • Abalone Shell Pour for Cold Process Soap



Abalone Shell Colors are applied to the side of a log mold using squeeze bottles. If desired, browns, copper and gold or white and gray could be used instead to make different varieties of clam shells using the same process. The soap needs to be fairly fluid throughout this pour. This is achieved by mixing the initial soap to emulsion but not more. Then, after the pour is complete, I put the soap in my soap oven at 170 degrees F for 1 hour, then let the soap sit in the oven until it is cool.


Avocado Soap Ingredients:

- 1. 75% (27.5 oz) Avocado Oil
- 2. 25% (9.2 oz) Coconut oil
- 3. 5.1 oz Food Grade NaOH
- 4. 9.8 oz Filtered or Distilled water
- 5. 2.3 oz Lavender essential oil + 0.40oz Jojoba Oil

1 Tablespoon of Titanium Dioxide was added to the Water and NaOH mixture.

About 2/3 of the soap was left white and 1/3 of the soap was divided into 6 colors listed on the next page.

Activated Charcoal does not accelerate trace as much as Nocturnal (from Nurture soap) does.

CHAPTER 2

Soap Weaving "Untamed" All Natural Cold Process Soap



Lavender Rose

Alternating colors of soap are squeezed onto all four sides of the mold in a manner like weaving a basket to create a tiger cat fur pattern in a log soap mold.

Two soaps are discussed in this chapter. The first soap is made with all natural soap colorants including Titanium dioxide and the second is made Goats Milk and with all natural soap colorants without titanium dioxide. The second soap shows an example of how the soap looks if the soap gets thick and if no titanium dioxide is used.

1. 18 oz Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg

2.18 oz Olive Oil

3.15.15 oz of Refined Shea butter

4.13.7 oz of Filtered Water

5.7.2 oz of Food Grade NaOH

6. Cotton ball size piece of Tussah Silk

7.1 Tablespoon Jojoba Oil

This soap is easiest to make if it is a fairly fluid batter. This is achieved by mixing the soap only to emulsion as discussed in chapter 2 of ebook 1.

This soap tends to get thick faster than the other soap made with water. It should be mixed minimally to emulsion to keep it as fluid as possible for the pour.

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CHAPTER 3

The Clam Swirl using All Natural Cold Process Soap



The Clam swirl is similar to the tree ring swirl technique used by fluid acrylic artists. The soap has to be fairly thick, but not too thick for this swirl to work best. The swirl produces a soap with an amazing, extraordinary appearance and could be modified in log molds to make other cool designs and patterns.

Shea Soap 1 Ingredients:

1. 18 oz Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg

2.18 oz Olive Oil

3.15.15 oz of Refined Shea butter

4.13.7 oz of Filtered Water

5.7.2 oz of Food Grade NaOH

6. Cotton ball size piece of Tussah Silk

7.1 Tablespoon Jojoba
Oil



The soap used to make the Clam soap is the same as the first soap made in Chapter 2. It had thickened a bit while I poured "Untamed" so the leftover soap was perfect to use for the pour. When the soap is a little too thick, a little Jojoba oil can be added to make it a bit thinner. It will only make the soap more luxurious and moisturizing.

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CHAPTER 4

Pouring a Perpendicular Line in a Log Mold

Section 1: Making a Water Spout/Tornado



A VERY cool perpendicular line is poured into a log soap mold to fashion a water spout/tornado. It is easy to pour and you can use a strainer or strainer spoon to make the clouds. Only Activated charcoal is used to color this all natural soap made to look like tornado clouds with a water spout coming down. This new technique is a pretty amazing way to pour perpendicular lines into soap that could be used to form many interesting designs.

Making "Aquarium"



Soap Weaving, Strainer spoon, and Sea Swirl techniques are applied to make an underwater scene that resembles an aquarium. Blues, greens and Lavender colors are combined with Lavender and Spearmint Essential oils to present a soothing, fragrant and beautiful bar of soap. The soap was briefly mixed to emulsion for this pour.

Shea Soap Ingredients:

1. 12 oz Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg

2.12 oz Olive Oil

3.10.1 oz of Refined Shea butter

4.9.1 oz of Filtered Water

5. 4.8 oz of Food Grade NaOH

6. Cotton ball size piece of Tussah Silk



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CHAPTER 6

Making "Shade Tree" Shaving Cold Process Soap



Dark tree trunk colors are poured onto the bottom of a log mold. White soap is then applied alternately to both long sides of the mold using a squeeze bottle. The soap from the sides pushes the dark colors up in the middle to form a tree trunk. Brown was poured down the middle on the bottom of the mold, then black on one side to simulate shade and gray on the other side to simulate light. The leaves were applied using strainers starting with darker shades of green at the bottom and lighter greens as you go up to the top.



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

2.12 oz Olive Oil

3.10.1 oz of Refined Shea butter

4.9.1 oz of Filtered Water

5. 4.8 oz of Food Grade NaOH

6. Cotton ball size piece of Tussah Silk

Making Lollipops and Waves Cold Process Soap



Three pieces of cardboard are cut and fit together to make a star shaped divider for circular mold cavities. 6 different colors are then added to each section. The colors are then swirled with a simple swirl to form a pinwheel, spiral or wave pattern. These soaps are ideal for being pierced with a skewer to form adorable party favors.

1. 12 oz Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg

2. 12 oz Olive Oil



It is important to use completely flat cardboard pieces to make a seal on the bottom. I always use the uncut, straight part of a box top or cardboard piece. The slits were cut in the middle of the rectangle.

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CHAPTER 9

Making "BLACK MESA" Cold Process Soap



Mesa (Spanish for table) is the term for an elevated area of land with a flat top and sides that are usually steep cliffs. In this video, the horizontal line pour combined with an essential oil that speeds trace a bit results in the effect of a Mesa type formation in the soap scene. I think of this as a large, unmovable rock:) I think it is interesting that the same technique to pour a horizontal line can be used to produce rock-like structures just by adding a fragrance that accelerates trace. A swirled soap could be used instead of just black to produce interesting mountains.

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• CHAPTER 10

Making "A Quiet, Solitary Path" Cold Process Soap



Soap weaving, the Horizontal Pour method and the Sea Swirl are used to create a scene of a beautiful, mountain path in the wilderness. A gold, black and gray path is formed by first pouring a sea swirl onto the bottom. Greens, black and yellow are poured alternately along the sides of the mold using squeeze bottles to push the gold path up and to form relief lines to look like a rising hill. Finally blue gray and white are poured into a pitcher for a dirty pour over the top using the sea swirl.



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

Making "Sea Swell" Cold Process Soap



A Sea Swell is a wave that has enough energy to travel well beyond the place of its origin. It marches in broad lines and with big gaps between each crest.

Soap weaving and the Sea Swirl are used to create a scene of a Sea Swell in the ocean. A dam/weir is used to dump a fairly even swell into the side of the soap.



1. 12 oz Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg

2.12 oz Olive Oil

3.10.1 oz of Refined Shea butter

4.9.1 oz of Filtered Water

5. 4.8 oz of Food Grade NaOH



Making "Prism Light" Cold Process Soap



Inspired by a spectrum of colors emitted from a prism, soap with a rainbow of colors is poured using the horizontal line pour. The colors remain remarkably separate and consistent as they are pushed into a triangular pattern during the pour. Wooden skewers are placed on the bottom of the mold to serve as little dividers keeping the colors separate. Colors are carefully poured into lines using squeeze bottles. The skewers are removed, then white soap is applied to the sides of the mold to push the colors into a triangular pattern.

- 2. 1/4 tsp Orange Vibrance
- 3. 1/4 tsp Yellow Vibrance
- 4. 1/8 tsp Green oxide
- 5. 1/8 tsp Neon Blue

- 8. 2 tsp Titanium Dioxide





It is made with Organic Lemon essential oil and Litsea Cubeba Essential oil to add spunk, making it a happy soap almost GUARANTEED to put you in a GOOD MOOD. Stripes and spots are formed on the bottom of a log mold, then soap is filled in on one side of the mold producing a graceful swirl to one side. Meow!



Delicate wing like patterns are created simply by applying color to one side of a log mold using squeeze bottles of colored soap. The Perfect Man fragrance oil was used which caused the soap trace to accelerate a bit. This property, combined with adding a bit of fragrance oil at a time to the base soap resulted in the two tiered pattern of double wings. The result is interesting and unique.

CHAPTER 16

Making Lavender Lane Abstract Art Cold Process Soap



A simple, thin line pattern is applied to one side of a log mold using squeeze bottles. The technique produces lanes of color that are consistent throughout the soap. There is a lot of information that can be gleaned from paying careful attention to the squeeze pattern and the resulting soap pattern. If you study the soap carefully, you can envision other soap designs that could arise using this technique.

CHAPTER 17

Making Line Art Scenes in Cold Process Soap



A thin line pattern can be applied to the long sides of a log mold using squeeze bottles. The technique produces lanes of color that can be made into a scene with contrasting color schemes. The scene is formed facing the long side of the mold in a manner similar to sand art. It is built from the bottom up. In this soap, two similar but different scenes are made on each side of the soap resulting in a two-sided scene soap. The scenes are amazingly miniature and delicate.

CHAPTER 19

Making "Undulation" Cold Process Artistic Soap Soap



An Undulation is a wavelike form, outline, or appearance. An undulation is formed in soap by pouring dirty pour swirls along the side of a log mold using a cardboard weir and squeeze bottles. A thin gap along the edge of the mold was used in the same manner as a squeeze bottle applying soap to the side. The cardboard weir is effective for controlling a nice soap stream along the side of a log mold and the dirty pour produces a complex, unique and beautiful wave swirl.

The log is cut into 4 bars along the box lines, then again down the middle parallel to the long side of the mold to reveal a beautiful wing like pattern. During the pour, a column of yellow is applied to form an abstract body.







The modified Box Weave Bird technique is used to pour a pattern that resembles a bird of prey. This soap is designed with the front and sides showing the outstretched wings, a back showing feathers and it even has a bottom that looks like the bottom of the bird with its body and tail feathers! The shavings from planing the soap are used to mold easy bodies for the front of the soap. Cardboard dividers are inserted into a log mold to make 4 rectangular shapes. Soap is then applied to the 4 sides of each using squeeze bottles. The log is cut into 4 bars along the box lines, then again down the middle parallel to the long side of the mold to reveal a beautiful bird with outstretched wings. During the pour, a column of color is applied to form an abstract body, but this is embellished later with soap clay for a more beautiful finish.



Making "Best Friends" All Natural Cold Process Soap



Artsy, emotive soaps resembling marble statues of best friends are formed with a quick pour followed by simple, primitive sculptures made from the planed scraps. A Strainer with 4 rows of holes is placed over a log mold. Very liquid base soap is first poured into the mold to about 2/3 full. Then, naturally colored black(activated charcoal), gray(Bentonite clay) and white(Titanium Dioxide) soap is poured over the holes to form 2 pairs of feet and legs. The soap is cut, planed and beveled and the soap scraps are used to form simple bodies to fit the feet. The sculptures are easy and only take about 15 minutes to form for each soap.

2. 12 oz Olive Oil

3. 10.1 oz of Refined Shea butter

4. 9.1 oz of Filtered Water



Let's go astray, even further out of the Soap Art box, to consider another form of Soap Art-Soap Opera! Ok, I admit Stray Cat Blues is a bit primitive, but it illustrates a fun soap art idea that is worth thinking about! Did you know that the first TV soap operas were made to sell soap?! The term soap opera originated from radio dramas being sponsored by soap manufacturers (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Soap_opera)

Imagine the fun of watching musicals, operettas, dramas, comedies or stories featuring soaps with characters and props that you could buy! LOL I hope you have fun thinking of the potential!

Cat tail lines are "drawn" in soap using soap weaving and very simple cat sculptures are formed on the tops. This all natural soap is scented with Peppermint Essential oil and made with only Activated Charcoal and Titanium Dioxide as the colorants.

1. 12 oz Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg

2. 12 oz Olive Oil

3. 10.1 oz of Refined Shea butter

4. 9.1 oz of Filtered Water

The cats are formed by first rolling out a cylinder of soap. Next, ears are pinched at the top. Then whiskers are pinched out. A neck is formed by pinching below the whiskers a bit. Little holes are made for the eyes and nose and black soap clay is put into the eye and nose holes for the white cat. A black nose is put on the black cat. Black whiskers lines are then stuck onto the pinched out clay of the whiskers on the white cat. Then, 3 little balls are used to form the mouth area and 4 little balls are used to form the feet. A knife tool is used to make indentations in the feet for the toes. Simple trash cans were made on some soaps by gouging out lines and filling them with black soap clay.

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

Fragrances that cause soap to turn brown are often wonderful to smell, but a challenge to make into beautiful soap. Lemon lover's soap, my most popular of all time, is an example of this. A dark Umber band of color with the fragrance oil is a good solution to the problem. The color contrast provides beauty and the dark color contains the yummy fragrance. The bands are formed by mixing portions of the soap to a thick trace. The beautiful vase/stem effect is formed with squeeze bottles and soap weaving. The flowers at the top are poured through a strainer spoon and topped off with simple flowers formed with squeeze bottles and a skewer.



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

Soap weaving and carefully controlling trace are two techniques used to create layers and a lovely feathery pattern in this soap designed especially for men. Perfect Man and Vanilla Extract Fragrance oils along with Jojoba oil, Bentonite Clay, and real silk are added to provide a pleasant shaving experience that will leave the skin smooth, fragrant and soft. Women would certainly love the soap too. The bands add beauty and interest while keeping the bar as white as possible for actual use. Activated charcoal, gray, gold and white add stunning contrast to soap, but when it comes to actually using the soap, white is often preferable. I tried Nurture Soap's Winter White for the first time in this soap. You can see what you think. I added Perfect Man Fragrance and a touch of Magnolia fragrance to the bottom white band, so that makes it a bit more tan. The white in the feathers has no fragrance added to it.

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CHAPTER 32

Easy Mountains: Introducing the Tent Pour for Cold Process Soap



A beautiful, interesting, shaving salt spa soap is made with the aide a cardboard rectangle folded in half. The tent like V shape is cut to fit in a log soap mold. This structure acts as a double weir-one for each side of the mold. Soap is then poured over the peak of the V and flows down the sides into the mold. By alternating colors, the appearance of mountains can be formed. The sky containing Bentonite Clay and Activated Charcoal is poured into the bottom of the mold first, then the rest of the colors are poured over the tent into the mold. For this soap, salt soap is added at the end of the pour to suggest rocks in the topography and to give the benefits of Celtic Salt.

A new, easy and cool technique is used to form a pot in a soap mold using a piece of cardboard. Trace is controlled by adding an few drops of Oregano Essential oil and Peppermint oil to soap just before pouring to accelerate the thickening of the soap. This is done to prepare quickly for pouring the next layers. The pot was filled with Himalayan salt soap to give the soap the benefits of salt and to add the texture that suggests "pot". Flowers are made by pouring soap through a strainer spoon. The soap is scented with Peppermint and Oregano Essential oils and a touch of Perfect Man fragrance oil. This would be a great soap design for Valentine's Day or Mother's Day!



As the soap travels down the sides and up into the center of the mold, the cardboard baffles direct the soap, making an interesting pattern. 



The cardboard baffle acts to divide the soap on either side and to deflect the flow of soap as it flows into the mold from the side. The resulting pattern resembles a surging wave or maybe an oyster shell.







A Jawbreaker or Gobstopper is a type of candy that consists of numerous layers with different flavors. As one layer dissolves, the next flavored layer is exposed. In the same way, this "Jawbreaker" soap is composed of multiple layers, each with a different FRAGRANCE. Of course, these are not meant for eating but are unique soaps that contain layers of individual fragrances in each soap. This is a very fun soap that gives people the opportunity to enjoy many of their favorite fragrances, one at a time, in one soap! You can make the layers all the same color or different colors. Marble designs would also work. There are no limits! This Jawbreaker soap is made to look like a baseball and has 3 layers with 3 different fragrances. All of the inner soap is white.

- 2. 12 oz Olive Oil

SOAP CLAY CHAPTER IS HERE

<--Jawbreaker soap is made with soap clay. The recipe for soap clay is this one, but youl can see all about how to prepare and store soap clay in this video.

I made white and red soap clay from extra soap leftover when I made loofah soap.

Each Soap is 6 ounces. Each 6 oz soap was divided into 3 pieces:

3 oz (50%) 1.8 oz (30%)

1.2 oz (20%)

1/8 tsp of Organic Orange essential oil was added to the 1.2 oz pieces. 1/8 tsp of Spearmint essential oil was added to the 1.8 oz pieces. 1/8 tsp of Perfect Man fragrance oil was added to the 3 oz pieces. A ball was formed out of the 1.2 oz pieces. Then, the 1.8 oz pieces were rolled out. The rolled out soap was then wrapped around the 1.2 oz ball and the new ball was formed. The 3 oz soap was then rolled out and wrapped around the ball to form the final ball. The stitching lines were etched and red "stitches" were added.

To make the entire batch of soap into jawbreaker balls, divide the soap into 50% for fragrance 1, 30% for fragrance 2 and 20% for fragrance 3. You can add the fragrance to the soap while making it or when mixing/mashing the soap into clay.


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CHAPTER 42 Making Abstract Amaryllis Cold Process Soaps



Soap is poured into a log mold using the perpendicular pour.
Next it is cut it into slices. After planing and beveling each soap, the scraps are used to form 3D petal extensions on top. The petals only take about 5 minutes per soap to form and are not meant to be perfect. A hand steamer gives the soaps a shiny, porcelain appearance.





- 1. 5 tsp Winter white. (see NOTE below)
- 2. 1/2 tsp Raspberry Red
- 3. 1/2 tsp Gray
- 4. 1/2 tsp Activated Charcoal
- 5. 1/8 tsp Yellow Vibrance + 1/8 tsp Celadon

NOTE: White tends to get thick fast so I add it to my soap in stages. I divided the white into 3 cups. Two cups have 2 tsp each and one cup has 1 tsp. The 1 tsp was for the flower top and the rest of the white was for the base soap.



Carnations, Wild Roses, Camellias and many more flower varieties are easy to make with at new technique that I have discovered. Before making the flowers, soap is first poured into a log mold using the perpendicular pour to form the base of the flower and the stem. Soap is also poured into another rectangular mold for the petals. Planing the soaps produces thin, ribbons of soap that easily fold to form foliage and delicate petals. The soft, malleable foliage and petals are easily pressed onto the tops of the soaps, forming AMAZING and easy flowers. A hand steamer gives the soaps a shiny, porcelain appearance. I highly recommend that you use the recipe given below in order to make sure that the petals form ribbons of the proper consistency.

Soap Ingredients:

- 1. 12.75 oz (25%) Organic Coconut Oil 76 deg
- 2. 17.70 oz (35%) Olive Oil
- 3. 20.25 oz (40%) of Avocado Oil
- 4. 13.5 oz of Filtered Water
- 5. 7.05 oz of Food Grade NaOH
- 6. 1 cotton ball size of silk

Aye, me hearties, it's a buried treasure map soap! A tiny heart is buried on one side of a soap and a map is poured on the other side. After curing, the map side is planed and formed into a scroll map that is placed over the heart side of the soap. An "X" marks the spot over the heart! You and I know what the treasure is, but the recipient of the soap will only find out when they use the soap to uncover the buried treasure. In order for a nice curl to form, this soap must cure at least a day or two before planing the map. What a great gift this would make for mother's day! The fragrance is a very yummy lemon vanilla.

Soap Ingredients for fish:

- 1. 18 oz Organic Coconut Oil-76 deg
- 2.18 oz Olive Oil
- 3. 15.15 oz of Refined Shea butter
- 4.13.7 oz of Filtered Water
- 5.7.2 oz of Food Grade NaOH
- 6. Cotton ball size piece of Tussah Silk

It is important to let the soap cure overnight or for a day or two before planing the soap map.

CHAPTER 50 Making "Landscrapes" Cold Process Soap







Soap shavings can be designed to make beautiful, complex patterns and allow color to be layered in a way similar to watercolor paintings. They can also be folded into quick vegetation, tablecloths and more. In this video, 3D Landscape soap art is made using soap shavings. The shavings make cool veneers and act like soap stickers -they are easily applied to fresh soap. Soap weaving is first used to pour a canvas background soap in a log mold, but you can start with any bar of freshly made soap. Then, small accent soaps that are designed to be planed to produce landscape elements are poured. These little soaps are planed to produce veneers that can be cut using shaped cutters or formed into the shape of flowers, pots, paper airplanes, napkins, lakes, trees or anything else you can imagine. The delicate shavings can be protected by dipping them in clear melt and pour soap after they have cured on the soap.

- 2.18 oz Olive Oil
- 3.15.15 oz of Refined Shea butter
- 4.13.7 oz of Filtered Water
- 5.7.2 oz of Food Grade NaOH

A whole world of possibilities opens up with this new 3D soap design. A hole is cut in a bar of freshly made cold process soap, then a 3D scene is inserted into the hole using soap shavings. The shavings make cool veneers and act like soap stickers -they are easily applied to fresh soap. The veneers can also be cut using shaped cutters or formed into the shape of flowers, pots, paper airplanes, napkins, lakes, trees or anything else you can imagine. Clear melt and pour soap can be poured int the holes to protect the art or add different effects. The holes can be cut in any shape to fit any design you can imagine.

Soap Ingredients for fish:

- 1. 18 oz Organic Coconut Oil-76 deg
- 2.18 oz Olive Oil
- 3. 15.15 oz of Refined Shea butter
- 4.13.7 oz of Filtered Water
- 5.7.2 oz of Food Grade NaOH
- 6. Cotton ball size piece of Tussah Silk

2 Tablespoons of Titanium dioxide was added to the lye water for the white bars. Two molds were used to make bars with two fragrances.

Two batches of soap were made. One batch was used to make white soap bars which served as the canvases. Another batch was made to serve as the colored veneers that were shaved to form the art.



The first batch made all white bars.

Let your imagination fly and make your own, whimsical secret garden soap.



These soaps would make lovely bars on their own, but they were designed to serve as veneer soaps for upcoming projects.

One of the convenient features of the pinstripe is that the stripes have different spacings. This will come in handy when selecting the right scale for art.

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

White veneers and pinstripe veneers are placed in the proper places to make a really cute grand piano soap.







Here's a fun soap for all of your golfing friends. Here's a fun soap for all of your golfing friends. Greens, blues and white soap are poured over a cardboard tent that acts as a weir and into a soap mold. The goal it to pour the colors in such a manner as to make the soap look like an abstract golf course scene with greens, fairways, water hazards and sand traps. Small red and black soaps are poured to provide veneers for the flags and holes. A plane is adjusted to make thick slices of veneer, and thick white and black veneers are shaved from soaps. A less thick red strip is also planed. A hole is cut in place that looks like a green, a black hole is inserted, then a smaller hole is cut in the black hole for the flag to sit. A thin, but sturdy white strip is cut for the flag pole that can fit in the hole. A red flag is cut and wrapped around the pole to make the flag. The flag can be taken in and out of the hole, and multiple flags can be made to ship with the soap. The recipient of the soap can place the flag into the hole for display. Lemongrass and Litsea cubeba cause this lemony soap to beam with happy fragrance that would brighten any day.

I made it with my usual shea butter recipe and it does seem to have a more frothy lather. The carbonation and alcohol in the beer is removed by boiling before the lye is added to it. This gives a well behaved soap that can be poured into beautiful swirls. For this soap, soap weaving is used to pour lines into a soap mold in a way that resembles foliage splays. Then, the soap is planed to provide veneers. These veneers are cut into strips and woven just like a basket to make a beautiful "container" for the foliage. Basket weaving is only one way to weave the strips of soap. They can be braided or woven in other ways as well. Soap is actually a suitable medium for weaving! This opens up a whole new array of soap art design possibilities.

Soap Ingredients:

- 1. 18 oz Organic Coconut Oil-76 deg
- 2.18 oz Olive Oil
- 3. 15.15 oz of Refined Shea butter
- 4.13.7 oz of Boiled, Decarbonated beer
- 5.7.2 oz of Food Grade NaOH

Any color can be used to weave baskets.







THE COLORS

- 1. 2 tsp Winter White
- 2. 1/2 tsp Copper Penny
- 3. 1/2 tsp activated charcoal
- 4. 1/4 tsp Green Oxide
- 5. 2 TBS Titaniuim Dioxide added to the beer/lye mixture

THE FRAGRANCE

1. 0.45 oz Jojoba oil +0.5 oz Coffee Essential oil
